## Our identified priorities for academic year 2017/18

## Continued Meaningful staff CPD

- Leeds Rhinos CPD package £2000. Matt from Leeds Rhinos will come in for half a day
  a week for 3 half terms to deliver PE lessons to all year groups and lunchtime clubs.
  This will count towards staff CPD but we have cut the package in half this year due to
  staff already having had this CPD for over a year now.
- More free courses for all staff through Leeds Active Schools.
- Subject Leader Modules 1-3 for D Wilkinson through Active Schools.
- Swimming courses for D Wilkinson to enable him to take his own class swimming.
- REAL PE courses for VJ and DW to ensure the subject leaders are fully informed.
- Rhinestones Dance have once again been booked in for Year 5 and 6 for Spring 1. This
  session is great for engaging all the children in dance and especially inspiring the boys to
  dance.

# A more consistent approach to planning and assessment, in line with the introduction of the new curriculum.

- Although we have now invested in the Real PE scheme, money will continue to be spent on ensuring all activities are properly resourced and staff are sufficiently trained.
- PE will now be assessed by all staff using Depth of Learning.

#### Greater participation in sporting after school clubs

- Starting in September 2017 we will be employing Premiere Sport to come into school to deliver 2 after school clubs a week on Mondays and Tuesdays. The Monday club will be a fun club and we intend to offer more unusual sports in this club (eg: Fencing, Ultimate Frisbee). The Tuesday club will be a free 'Play Active club', which will aim to engage children in after school sport who may not have otherwise considered a sports club.
- PP children's participation in after school clubs continues to be subsidised by PP funding.

#### Swimming

• In an effort to ensure that all children leave our school able to swim the minimum distance of 25m (National Curriculum requirement) the Year 4s who were unable to swim this distance upon leaving Year 3 are being invited to continue their lessons this year. Any additional costs will be covered by the SSP money.

### Greater participation in competitive school sport

- Any costs associated with attending more competitive school sport will be funded by the SSP (transport etc).
- We will once again enter the Skipping Schools festival for Year 2 and will take part in 2 workshops. Year 4 have also been entered into Skipping Schools again this year as that year group benefited so much from it in Year 2.

#### Leeds Active Schools Initiative

• We will continue to be involved in this initiative as their guidance throughout the past 3 years has been invaluable. £1200.

# Making physical activity more prevalent in the culture of the school, particularly break time and lunch times:

- Money to be used to increase First Steps sports coaches hours so that they are on the
  playground from 12-1pm on Wednesdays and Thursdays. They will run games with the
  children and encourage the children to be physically active.
- SSP money will go towards renewing the playground markings to make them much more colourful, fun and useful. We will invest in a Daily Mile track around the edges of the playground to make delivery of the Daily Mile easier for all yeargroups.

### Storage

 We will purchase new storage boxes for some of the smaller pieces of equipment (beanbags etc) as quite a few have been damaged making them dangerous for the children to carry around.

#### Status within school

- A new noticeboard for the new building to advertise and celebrate the success of our sporting teams.
- New plaques for the Sports Day trophies in the entrance hall.

#### Resources

 We are constantly updating our resources for PE in school. This year we are looking to purchase new basketball hoops for the walls surrounding the playground and new netball nets and bibs enabling us to run a netball after school club.
