SCHOOL SPORT PREMIUM FUNDING (Nov 16)

As part of the legacy from the 2012 London Olympic Games the Government recently announced that from September 2013 schools will receive an additional £8000 (plus £5 per pupil) to improve the quality and breadth of Physical Education and sport provision at school. This money is also intended to be used to encourage children to become more physically active and adopt healthier lifestyles.

After careful consideration from the PE subject leaders, in conjunction with head teacher Ms Harbrow, and with input from our children via the school council, we have decided to continue spending the money in ways that ensure it has a long lasting impact on the teaching and learning of our pupils. We received £9400 in total for the academic year 2015/16 and will receive £9762 this year (2016/17).

Our identified priorities for academic year 2015/16 were -

Continued Meaningful staff CPD

- Leeds Rhinos CPD package £4000. Tony Aubrey from Leeds Rhinos will continue to come in 1 day a week for 3 half terms to deliver PE lessons to KS2 and lunchtime clubs. This will count towards staff CPD as all staff will observe lessons, team-teach, plan & assess jointly and be observed teaching during the year.
- Leeds Rhinestones (dance) £600. Rhinestones are coming back in the Spring Term to deliver dance sessions for Year 5. This will also count towards staff CPD as above.
- A gymnastics coach will hopefully be coming in during the Spring term to deliver
 Gymnastics sessions for Year 6 CPD that the Year 6 staff have requested.
- More free courses for all staff through Leeds Active Schools.
- A half day 'catch-up' training session on Real PE scheduled for January 2016.
- Subject Leader Modules 1-3 for M Osborne through Active Schools.

A more consistent approach to planning and assessment, in line with the introduction of the new curriculum.

 Although we have now invested in the Real PE scheme, money will continue to be spent on ensuring all activities are properly resourced and staff are sufficiently trained.

Greater participation in after school clubs

- PP children's participation in after school clubs continued to be subsidised by PP funding.
- 2 new after school clubs to be introduced through the year on Mondays and Tuesdays offering 'alternative' sports ballet, martial arts, cycling etc. Ballet will recommence after Christmas on Tuesday and hopefully martial arts on Mondays.

Greater participation in competitive school sport

• 'Sports Leader' - £2000. Miss O'Brien will continue to work within our cluster of schools and will be working with all year groups during this academic year to help with and increase involvement in Interschool competitions.

- Any costs associated with attending more competitive school sport will be funded by the SSP.
- We will once again enter the Skipping Schools festival for Year 2 and request the day long workshop.

Spare PE kit for PP children

• We will be investing in bags of spare PE kit for each year group.

Leeds Active Schools Initiative

• We will continue to be involved in this initiative as their guidance throughout the past 2 years has been invaluable. £1000.

Year 6 Play Leaders

First Steps will be training up 20 of our Year 6s to become lunchtime Play Leaders. Any
costs for additional equipment or uniform (caps) will come out of SSP money. The Play
Leader initiative should lead to greater participation in physical activity at lunchtimes,
increased confidence and teaching skills from the Play leaders and improved behaviour
both at lunchtimes and throughout afternoon lessons.

Our identified priorities for academic year 2016/17

Continued Meaningful staff CPD

- Leeds Rhinos CPD package £2000. Matt from Leeds Rhinos will come in for half a day
 a week for 3 half terms to deliver PE lessons to all year groups and lunchtime clubs.
 This will count towards staff CPD but we have cut the package in half this year due to
 staff already having had this CPD for over a year now.
- More free courses for all staff through Leeds Active Schools.
- Subject Leader Modules 1-3 for D Wilkinson through Active Schools.

A more consistent approach to planning and assessment, in line with the introduction of the new curriculum.

• Although we have now invested in the Real PE scheme, money will continue to be spent on ensuring all activities are properly resourced and staff are sufficiently trained.

Greater participation in sporting after school clubs

- PP children's participation in after school clubs continues to be subsidised by PP funding.
- The school council asked children what after school clubs they'd like in an effort to increase participation. 5 new after school clubs are therefore being offered this academic year and already the take up of after school clubs has increased.

Swimming

• In an effort to ensure that all children leave our school able to swim the minimum distance of 25m (National Curriculum requirement) the Year 4s who were unable to swim this distance upon leaving Year 3 are being invited to continue their lessons this year. Any additional costs will be covered by the SSP money.

Greater participation in competitive school sport

- 'Sports Leader' £2000. Miss O'Brien will continue to work within our cluster of schools and will be working with all year groups during this academic year to help with and increase involvement in Interschool competitions.
- Any costs associated with attending more competitive school sport will be funded by the SSP.
- We will once again enter the Skipping Schools festival for Year 2 and will take part in 2 workshops. Year 4 have also been entered into Skipping Schools this year as that year group benefited so much from it in Year 2.

Leeds Active Schools Initiative

• We will continue to be involved in this initiative as their guidance throughout the past 3 years has been invaluable. £1000.

Making physical activity more prevalent in the culture of the school, particularly break time and lunch times:

Money will be used to purchase stop watches, speed bounce stations, skipping ropes
and tape measures, all of which will be used by the children at break time in order to
encourage more physical activity on the playground. These have been assigned to
different stations on our playground, which the children can challenge themselves to
attempt.

- Leeds Carnegie will be training up 20 of our Year 5s and 6s to become lunchtime Play Leaders. Any costs for additional equipment or uniform (caps) will come out of SSP money. The Play Leader initiative should lead to greater participation in physical activity at lunchtimes, increased confidence and teaching skills from the Play leaders and improve behaviour both at lunchtimes and throughout afternoon lessons.
- The PE team will be researching new playground markings and running tracks this year, with the intention of upgrading our outside space in the next couple of years to make it more focussed towards physical activity. We will be using the SSP money for this.
